In March of 2020, our world changed and our lives were turned upside down by the COVID-19 pandemic. The first COVID-19 case in Demarest was reported in March 2020. One year later, the borough has a total of over 250 reported cases. The advent of the vaccine means that the outlook for this year is more hopeful. Let's Help Make Recycling Effective

- ~containers must be clean and empty.
- ~All containers with recycling numbers 1-7 are accepted.
- ~All glass, plastic, waxed paper and metal containers are accepted for recycling.
- ~Dried paint cans with lids off are recyclable.

Electronics and white goods may be brought to the dumpster at the DPW (22 Wakelee Drive).

The following items are not recyclable

- ~boxes with residue (e.g., pizza boxes)
- ~used paper plates, paper cups or paper towels
- ~Styrofoam, plastic bags, plastic shopping bags
- ~plastic knives, forks, spoons or dishes
- ~ceramic, pottery, crystal, cups, plates or glasses, flowerpots, garden hoses.
- ~windows, plate glass, mirror glass or light bulbs
- ~meat trays
- ~automotive-use containers like antifreeze jugs or motor oil bottles
- ~household batteries
- ~building and construction material

From Our Police Chief

<u>Bicycle Helmets</u> Please remind your children that in New Jersey, anyone under 17 years of age that rides a bicycle, is a passenger on a bicycle or is towed as a passenger by a bicycle must wear a safety helmet.

<u>Walking Dogs without a Leash</u> Please remember Ordinance 89-1: No person owning, harboring, keeping, walking or protecting any dog, whether licensed or unlicensed, shall permit said dog to run at large or unleashed off the premises owned, leased, rented or occupied by such person within the territorial limits of the borough.

<u>9 PM Routine</u> Adopt the 9 PM Routine: Check your vehicles each night by 9 PM; ensure your vehicle is safe and secure and that valuables have been removed.

Alerts and Notifications The Demarest Police Department and the Demarest Office of Emergency Management use two different companies to communicate alerts to the residents. Nixle sends a text message and email to residents, and Swiftreach sends a recorded voice message to landlines. If you would like to receive alerts and advisories from the Demarest Police Department, Text 07627 to 888-777 to optin to Nixle. To make sure you are receiving landline messages from Swiftreach, please sign up on the Police Department website and click on the Swiftreach graphic to enter the portal.

<u>Child Seat Installations</u> In many instances, parents and caregivers do not install child seats correctly. Child Passenger Safety Technicians (CPSTs) are trained to assist with the installation and ensure the safety of these child seats. The Demarest Police Department has assigned Police Officer Del Greco as the Child Passenger Safety Technician. Officer Del Greco can assist Demarest Borough residents who would like help with the installation or inspection of a child seat. 

COVID-19 UPDATE

It is important to remember that social distancing and mask-wearing continue even after getting the vaccine! You may have seen it on the news, but there are some patients who are still being infected with coronavirus AFTER the vaccination. An immune response can take several weeks to fully develop. Many of these patients were getting infected 2-3 days after the first dose. STAY VIGILANT! STAY PROTECTED! STAY SAFE!

Get Help Scheduling an Appointment: For help with the New Jersey Vaccine Scheduling System, visit covid19.nj.gov/vaccinehelp or call 855-568-0545 for phone support from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Due to high call volumes, callers are experiencing long wait times.

It is important that you be registered. There are multiple registration sites; it will take patience and determination to get through, but we encourage you to keep at it. NOTE: Call center staff can only register and schedule people who are in the New Jersey Vaccine Scheduling System.

PLEASE KEEP VIGILANT!

- ✓ Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around people who don't live with you.
- ✓ Masks protect YOU and OTHERS!
- ✓ Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from others.
- ✓ Avoid crowds. The more people you are in contact with, the more likely you are to be exposed to COVID-19.
- ✓ Avoid unventilated indoor spaces. If indoors, bring in fresh air by opening windows and doors.
- ✓ Clean your hands often, with soap & water for 20 seconds or sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- ✓ Get vaccinated against COVID-19 when it's your turn.
- ✓ Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- ✓ Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- ✓ Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces daily.

CCO Reminder from the Building Department

In order to rent or sell your home, a Certificate of Continued Occupancy is required. The form can be located on the Demarest website (demarestnj.org). You must complete the application, pay the required fees and have the home inspected prior to any change in occupancy or ownership. The Shade Tree Commission

New Jersey has a long history of trying to manage its tree resources, and that is where the Shade Tree Commissions enters the picture. The Demarest Shade Tree Commission is tasked with building a healthy, safe and resilient urban forest. With each tree we add to the community, we are attempting to improve the lives of our residents by establishing a healthy balance between people and trees. Our trees benefit the environment by improving the air quality, capturing carbon emissions and providing habitats for our wildlife. On the social level, the trees and the parks and public areas in which they are planted add tranquility and beauty to our town.

Last year we were hit by some devastating storms that caused the loss of over sixty of our trees and wreaked havoc on our streets and power lines. Many of our town trees are majestic but aging. When the trees were originally planted, little thought was given to diversity or maintenance. Over the years it has become obvious that changes in the way we manage our urban forest must be made. Therefore, we hope to plant at least 60 new trees in the right of way and public areas. We will not be planting the traditional oaks and maples, but rather will be adding trees native to the area that will allow us to avoid the spread of tree diseases and accommodate the electrical wires that we depend on. In addition, the town has invested in equipment that will enable maintenance to be more effective and more efficient. We will be working with our Department of Public Works to assist in that important endeavor.

If you would like to have a tree planted in the right of way in front of your home (usually defined as 10 feet from the curb, although exceptions exist) please contact Lee Campbell at the Borough Hall (201-768-0167 x 130) and ask for a tree request form. It will be our pleasure to provide you with a tree.

Is Your Number Up?

Emergency personnel need to reach people as quickly as possible. Thus, it is vitally important that your house number be displayed in accordance with Borough Ordinance 78-2. The Police Department reminds you that your number must be affixed in a conspicuous manner on the front of your house so as to be plainly visible from the street. Additionally, you may display an additional house number on a post or mailbox, especially if the front of your house is not visible from the street. Please note that numbers on rocks or otherwise on the ground are not helpful, as they can be covered by leaves or snow.
